<u>Hedgehogs:</u>

Use your robot arms to sound out words. All the sounds you need are on your sound strip.

Use a finger space between each word.

Have a sound mat and tricky words somewhere that you can see them to help you.

Use a range of conjunctions in your sentences, such as when, so, unless and because.
