Context

Witchampton CE First School is a small rural Church of England first school serving the local community. The school is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of all pupils. Prevent forms part of the school's wider safeguarding responsibilities and is underpinned by our Christian vision of ensuring every child is known, valued and able to flourish. Staff understand that radicalisation can affect any child regardless of age, background or circumstance and remain vigilant to all forms of extremism.

Local Context

The school is situated in a rural Dorset village with a relatively low local risk of extremism. However, leaders recognise that the internet and social media increase children's exposure to extremist narratives regardless of geographical location. The school therefore maintains vigilance, ensuring online safety education and filtering systems remain effective.

Indicators Monitored

Leaders remain alert to pupils who may:

- Become isolated from peers.
- Express intolerant or extremist views.
- Show sudden changes in behaviour or beliefs.
- Access inappropriate online material.
- Display fixation on violence or extremist ideologies.
- Become vulnerable due to family circumstances, trauma or additional needs.

Any concerns are reported immediately to the DSL using the school's safeguarding procedures.

Training

- Annual Prevent training for all staff.
 - Prevent included within induction.
 - Annual safeguarding updates.
 - DSL and Deputy DSL maintain current safeguarding training.
 - Governors receive safeguarding and Prevent updates.

Overall Risk Assessment

Current Overall Prevent Risk: Low

The school's Christian vision, strong safeguarding culture, knowledgeable staff, effective leadership, robust online safety procedures and close relationships with pupils and families significantly reduce the likelihood of radicalisation. Leaders remain vigilant, recognising that online influences and emerging national risks require continual monitoring and regular review of safeguarding practice.
